2022 DENNIS MARION IMPACT AWARD WINNER: SARA STENGER

On Monday, May 23, 2022, the Dennis Marion Impact Award was presented to **Sara Stenger**, Administrator of Westmoreland County Behavioral Health/Developmental Services. Established in 2017, the award recognizes local and state government employees whose initiatives, processes, and projects have led to significant improvements in Pennsylvania's behavioral health service delivery system.

Sara was nominated by Heather McLean, Chair of the Ray of Hope Task Force. In her nomination letter, Heather wrote, "If I could give Sara a tag line it would be, WE NEED TO DO MORE because that's what she always says to me." Sara's many accomplishments include awarding the Ray of Hope with a full-time Outreach Coordinator and increasing the Community Advocate's position to a full-time position, which recognized "the importance of advocating for individuals struggling with mental health issues and giving them the best opportunity for support and maintaining their recovery."

Hello! I'm Lisa Goldberg, the new Ray of Hope Coordinator. I can't tell you how excited I am to be here! I can't wait to get started and I'm looking forward to meeting all of you. Here is a little about me. I grew up in St. Louis, Missouri. After graduating from Incarnate Word Academy, I moved to Houston. I have also lived on Galveston Island, in Chicago, and have now lived in Blairsville for the better part of 30 years. I have 3 sons and a German Shepherd named Isabella who is the center of our world!

I earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Marketing as an adult from IUP. After graduating, I worked in advertising for Greensburg's local radio station, WHJB, until a friend called one day with the opportunity of a lifetime. I was hired and trained to be an international flight attendant for a charter company who had contracts with the Department of Defense. We moved the U.S. Troops in and out of deployment and moved their families around the world. New QPR Suicide Prevention Gatekeeper Instructors now ready to deliver QPR Training!

On June 7, 2022, **Govan Martin**, Master Trainer from the QPR Institute and Chair / Executive Director of Suicide Prevention Alliance, conducted QPR Suicide Prevention Gatekeeper Instructor training to fourteen enthusiastic participants!

During this intensive 8-hour training, participants learned how to conduct QPR Gatekeeper Training, practiced role playing different scenarios, and learned strategies to support learners who may be new to suicide awareness and prevention.

Along with Heather McLean, Ray of Hope Task Force Chair, our new group of fourteen instructors would be happy to come to any agency or group and conduct this **FREE** 1.5-2 hour training. Just like CPR, QPR is an emergency response to someone in crisis and can save lives. QPR is the most widely taught Gatekeeper training in the world.

The key components of QPR Gatekeeper Training include how to question, persuade, and refer someone who may be suicidal; how to get help for yourself or learn more about preventing suicide; the common causes of suicidal behavior; the warning signs of suicide; and how to get help for someone in crisis.

Provided by the PCCD Grant, the Westmoreland Intermediate Unit (WIU) is offering 8-hour **Youth Mental Health First Aid** certification training at **NO COST** to participants 18 years and older. Training sessions include a participant manual and lunch.

Youth Mental Health First Aid is a comprehensive training specifically designed to equip educators, family members, and caregivers with the skills and knowledge to identify, understand, and respond to the signs or risk factors of mental health concerns in youth. Just as CPR helps you assist an individual having a heart attack, Youth Mental Health First Aid helps you assist someone experiencing a mental health or substance use-related crisis.
